We finished for February half term with a whole school attendance of 86% and an overall attendance of 88% for the academic year to date.

We had 37 pupils who had 100% for this half term and enjoyed their diamond time combined with WOW day.

We have had some real positives with attendance this half term! we average 79 pupils a week with 100% attendance, which is absolutely amazing!

There are also some real success stories of pupils overcoming their own personal attendance barriers and improving their own attendance to school.

We are really pleased to be able to share our partnership with MAGIC BREAKFAST which will start officially around mid-March.


This partnership will give us the opportunity to be able to offer a free breakfast to all pupils at High Point!

CLASS NEWS - 1C

Hi! The 1C team here! It has been yet another superb half term at High Point. Since coming back from the Christmas break, 1C have been doing some fantastic work in all of their subjects.

English

In English, 1C have been showing their skills using persuasion in their writing. They had to map out key words that are used in persuasive writing to create their very own leaflet about their made up magical school, using the AFOREST technique, students would ask rhetorical questions, alliteration as well as backing up their persuasion with facts and statistics. It goes without saying, we have a few future estate agents in 1C! After they created their leaflet, the class presented their work to the rest of their peers and staff and we are so proud of them for doing so.

Maths

In maths, 1C have been learning to tell the time in 12 and 24 hours as well as read bus timetables and answer questions based on time keeping. 1C have also started to learn how to count and use money and have created their own sums based on how much money they have and would spend on multiple items.

Forest Learning

1C absolutely LOVE Forest Learning. This half term they have had an introduction into different types of wood cutting tools and even practiced using them outside. Of course, without fail the staff bring out the hot chocolate and the students will soon let us know if it's up to their standards. Thankfully, it is! A lot of this session is based around exploring not only the outdoors but exploring with their peers and building friendships and I'm so pleased to say that 1C have an amazing bond during this lesson that continues to grow each time they are a part of it.

Science

Our science lessons are always fun and engaging. This half term, 1C have been learning all about solids, liquids and gases. They are able to explain what the term is called when a solid turns to a liquid, when a liquid turns to a gas and when a liquid turns to a solid. I'm sure if you were to ask them at home, they would be able to tell you! They have shown us how clever they are with their ability to retain all of this information and answer questions based on the subject.

DT

This half term in DT, 1C have been using tools and have been making their own fidget spinners. This requires them to design and then use a variety of tools and paints to sand and cut pieces of wood to make their very own designs come to life. 1C are doing so well when it comes to being safe around tools and are quickly gaining the knowledge of how to use them.

Maths - In maths we have been exploring multiplication and arrays. Pupils have been working hard, exploring sharing and equal groups. 1D are super sharers!

English - In English we have been focussing on rhyming words. We've had lots of fun practicing tongue twisters and matching rhyming words. Students have loved the funny story 'Fox in Socks' by Dr Seuss. We as always have been working on our sentence structure and punctuation. We are also getting super at spotting and using different adjectives.

Art – Pupils have been creating bright, colourful pop-art pieces of work. Pupil's have been using a variety of techniques with paint, crayons, felts and chalk to create their beautiful artwork.

CLASS NEWS - 2C

The children have been making super progress academically and we have enjoyed sharing their successes over the last couple of weeks.

English

In English this half term we have been learning about all things Gothic. We have become familiar with gothic settings such as dreary, dark weather, animals you would see in gothic settings and

talking about the fashion that would represent the gothic style. We are currently reading about Frankenstein, which has inspired us to do our own descriptive writing on a Gothic scene.

Maths

We have gained some valuable life skills on understanding how to tell the time through our work on clocks and 24-hour clocks too. Currently we are learning about money and have been understanding on how much things cost and using our laminate cash in class to role play buying things and calculating or change.

Forest School

In forest school we have been practicing our tool skills to saw wood cookies with a large saw. Our sawing skills have come on a long way and we are also doing things a lot more independently and safely. We still love just exploring in the forest and having our campfire chats.

Expressive arts

Our expressive arts lessons are where we get to let ourselves go in fun games and amazing characters. We have been coming together to engage in games such as cops and robbers, change three things and secret murder to put our drama skills in practice. This has enabled us to express our creativity with our body language, gestures and facial expressions.

CLASS NEWS - 2D

Hello parents and carers.

2D have had a fantastic term and we have seen some lovely levels of engagement in so many of our lessons!

English

We started the new term off by looking back at Dogman. We all read this book together before Christmas, and all of 2D thoroughly enjoyed it. We looked at the events of the story and completed a range of comprehension questions. Pupils also competed their own book review of Dogman. We then moved onto Poetry/Acrostic Poems and pupils explored their common features. Pupils finished the term by creating their own acrostic poems based upon seasons and common interests.

Maths

Our new topic started off with measurement. Pupils used equipment to record capacity using standard units of measure. They all had a go at recording measurements in litres. Our next topic was recalling properties of 3D shapes. 2D used practical resources to identify and describe the properties of the shapes - this included identifying the faces, lines of symmetry and vertices of a shapes. To finish off this topic 2D constructed a model building using 3D shapes and resources.

Science

The topic for this term was all about sound and we have enjoyed lots of practical investigations, exploring volume, pitch and sound insulators. We firstly conducted a survey around school to explore what sounds we could hear. Secondly, 2D took part in an experiment to understand how sound is created by vibrations. Our next experiment was to explore pitch sounds with glass and water - each glass was filled with a different amount of water to help us identify how pitch is affected by mass. Next, all pupils investigated sound insulators. Each pupil used a decibel meter to measure the volume of a sound.

Cooking for Life

This term, we have been looking at baking methods. We explored the science of baking and the use of fats and rising agents to aid food production. 2D have also been showing their increased awareness of food hygiene and safety in the kitchen, demonstrating some great skills for adulthood. 2D have really enjoyed making and tasting a range of both savoury and sweet products – our chocolate cake was a firm favourite amongst the pupils and staff!

CLASS NEWS - 3C

Hi Parents/Carers

Humanities: This term in Humanities, 3C has been exploring the rich and diverse history of women. The focus has been on the "suffragette movement," a significant and transformative period in women's history. By studying this movement, students are gaining insights into the struggles and triumphs of women who fought for their rights and autonomy.

The curriculum highlights the importance of understanding historical contexts and the impact of these movements on contemporary society. Through engaging discussions and activities, students are developing a deeper appreciation for the contributions of women throughout history.

3C have learnt about key figures in the suffragette movement such as Emmeline Pankhurst best known for organizing the women's suffrage movement in the United Kingdom to Emily Davison best remembered for her final protest, which caused her death.

This exploration not only broadens their historical knowledge but also fosters empathy and a greater understanding of social issues.

P.S.H.E: This term, 3C has been delving into the important topics of "How to deal with failure" and "emotion regulation." By understanding how these aspects affect daily life, students are learning to develop a growth mindset that helps them overcome challenges without feeling overwhelmed. The curriculum emphasizes accountability and taking ownership of actions, fostering a sense of responsibility. Through engaging worksheets and practical activities, such as role-playing scenarios where students practice handling disappointing news or resolving conflicts with peers, and group discussions, students are also enhancing their communication skills, which are crucial for expressing emotions and resolving conflicts. Team-based activities like collaborative problem-solving tasks and peer feedback sessions further reinforce these skills. This holistic approach not only builds resilience but also equips students with the tools to navigate life's ups and downs more effectively.

English: This term in English, 3C has been diving into the classic play "Macbeth" by William Shakespeare. Using this timeless work as a foundation, students are exploring various aspects of literature and writing. They are engaging in perspective writing, where they reimagine scenes from different characters' viewpoints, and delving into the art of monologuing and soliloquy, learning to express complex emotions and thoughts through powerful speeches.

The curriculum also includes analysing themes, character motivations, and the rich language of Shakespeare. Through group discussions and dramatic readings, students are developing a deeper understanding of the text and enhancing their critical thinking and interpretive skills. This immersive approach not only brings the play to life but also fosters a love for literature and creative expression.

Science: This term in science, 3C has been exploring the fascinating world of separation techniques. Students are learning about various methods used to separate mixtures into their individual components, such as filtration, distillation, and chromatography. Through hands-on experiments, they are discovering how these techniques are applied in real-life scenarios, from purifying water to separating pigments in ink. The curriculum emphasizes the importance of understanding the properties of different substances and how they interact.

Group activities, such as designing and conducting their own separation experiments, encourage teamwork and critical thinking. This engaging approach not only enhances their scientific knowledge but also fosters a deeper appreciation for the practical applications of science in everyday life.



CLASS NEWS - 3D

Hi parents and carers,

This half term has been jammed packed with lots of fun activities for 3D.

In English the class have been learning about Limerick poems. We have been looking at rhyming words and syllables to help our understanding of Limericks. The class have enjoyed clapping along to words to discover how many syllables are in each one. 3D will even be making their own class poem together.

For Maths this half term the class have been working on their subtraction abilities, using counters and objects to help with their counting. We have explored 2D shapes and their properties, they can now tell how many corners each shape has, and we are currently looking at measure. The class have been using rulers to measure in cm, we will soon be looking at measuring liquid. In Science 3D have been looking at electricity. The group have explored how we can use electricity within the house and with portable objects. The have looked at main electricity and battery electricity. 3D have been using circuits to understand better how electricity works, they enjoyed working in groups to create working circuits.

For forest learning this half term 3D have been looking at how to make shelters with Miss Joyce. They have enjoyed being outside experiencing new skills such as pegging the shelter, finding natural resources amongst socialising with their peers.

During our cooking for life lessons, we have been looking into the journey of food. The pupils have been learning about the journey from farm to plate for foods such as eggs, milk, cheese and flour. We have been enjoying delights such as mac and cheese, milkshakes and vegetable soup during these lessons.

Parents you will be delighted to know that 3D have been learning about cleaning the home in life skills. Pupils have been practicing their vacuuming, mopping and washing up skills. Get them to give you a demonstration at home, they are all experts now.

We hope you all have a lovely half term, regards the 3D team.
























CLASS NEWS - 4C



PFA...


