#### **Aims**

This policy statement aims to set out our school's arrangements for managing the access of education and training providers to students for the purpose of giving them information about their offer. It sets out:

- Procedures in relation to requests for access
- The grounds for granting and refusing requests for access
- Details of premises or facilities to be provided to a person who is given access

### **Statutory Requirements**

Schools are required to ensure that there is an opportunity for a range of education and training providers to access students in years 8 to 13 for the purposes of informing them about approved technical education, qualifications or apprenticeships.

Schools must also have a policy statement that outlines the circumstances in which education and training providers will be given access to these students.

This is outlined in section 42B of the <u>Education Act 1997</u>. the Skills and Post-16 Education Act 2022 and on page 43 of guidance from the Department for Education (DfE) on careers guidance and access for education and training providers.

The updated Provider Access Legislation (2023) states that schools should offer at least 2 encounters with providers of approved technical education qualifications or apprenticeships in Key Stage 3 and at least a further two in Key Stage 4.

This policy shows how our school complies with these requirements.

#### Student Entitlement

High Point Academy enables all students in years 7 to 11 to at least:

- 2 encounters for pupils during the 'first key phase' (year 8 or 9)
- 2 encounters for pupils during the 'second key phase' (year 10 or 11)

#### All students

- Find out about technical education qualifications and apprenticeship opportunities as part of our careers programme, which provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point
- Hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships
- Understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses

## Management of provider access requests

#### **Procedure**

A provider wishing to request access should contact, our careers lead by email – enquiry@highpoint.fet.ac or telephone 0121 5940750.

Local providers are invited to key relevant events that are held at High Point Academy. When holding a Year 11 parents evening we would, for example, invite apprenticeship providers, colleges, universities or other relevant groups.

High Point Academy policy on safeguarding sets out the Academy's approach to allowing providers into the Academy as visitors to talk to our students. At all times we ensure that there are no issues of safeguarding and that our students are always completely safe whilst meeting or speaking to external providers.

#### **Current Provider Access**

In light of the difficulties that many of our learners have in transitioning from their previous settings to High Point Academy, we do not feel that it is beneficial, nor meaningful to offer access to providers until year 9. Acceptions may be made to this where it is deemed appropriate.

From year 9, our learners begin to work with Connexions to plan their next steps for life after secondary school. This is an ideal opportunity to introduce them to a variety of providers, and we are keen to engage with as many as possilbe, in order to afford our pupils with all of the information about the opportunites available to them.

Provider access in 2023-2024 has included:

Sandwell College – Year 9/10 assembly

Tilbury Douglas – Meet the apprentice – Years 9 and 10

Walsall College – Year 10 employability course and discussions with course leaders

Sandwell Careers Fayre – November 2022 – Our year 10 cohort had the opportunity to meet with various providers and gain an insight into the options available to them.

#### Resources

Once visits have been agreed, the Academy will provide appropriate facilities to facilitate the visit, along with any equipment requested by the provider, where it is available. Sessions can be held in different venues according to the number of students and the requirements of the provider. Visits can be in the main hall and delivered to a greater number of students, or sometimes in the classroom with a smaller group. We also have the facility to deliver safe

personalised sessions. We are happy to work with providers to provide any resources we can that make their visit possible and we are happy to accommodate those that need to bring extra equipment into the Academy in order to showcase what they do.

Providers are welcome to leave a copy of their prospectus or other relevant course literature at reception for the attention of the Head Teacher. High Point Academy will place the literature in the library so it is available to students during the course of or directly after the Academy day.
